Kendrick D. Harris, Esq. is a respected real estate attorney, a leader within the real estate industry, and broader community.

Founder of the Harris Law Group, PLLC, he is a trusted counselor and advisor, representing real estate developers, commercial and multifamily property owners, investors and lenders in complex transactions. He has been involved in real estate deals and transactions totaling over \$600 million dollars.
